

For a year now, we have sacrificed and given up so much, it's hard to think of Lent in the ways we usually do. Lent is a season when we are invited to break our usual routines and focus on enhancing our relationship with God. We think of it as a sacrificial time, recognizing and remembering Christ's 40 days in the desert. Some of us choose to give up something that tempts us, that distracts us. Some choose to take on a new spiritual discipline. We give things up or take things on to interrupt our usual cycles of living that allow us to just continue to swim along the way we always have. Those interruptions, in their best form, remind us to turn our thoughts to loving God and neighbor.

For the past year, "normal" has gone out the window. Regular routines of life are interrupted constantly. It's difficult to plan ahead or to find things to look forward to when we don't know what the next weeks or months will bring in terms of exposures, shut-downs, and quarantines. We've given up meals out, live music and theatre, coffee with friends, and hugs. For most of the last year, we have given up worshiping in person together in our beautiful sanctuary, raising our voices together in song. We have taken on the disciplines of mask-wearing and social distancing. We have taken on cooking more at home and learning new tools for electronic communication. We have taken on virtual church and virtual work and virtual school.

In a way, it does feel as if we never left last year's Lent. As we enter into this new season of Lent, this continuing season of Lent, perhaps we can challenge ourselves to use all that we have given up and all that we have taken on as ways to interrupt our routines and turn toward loving God and neighbor. When we put on our masks, let us pray in gratitude for tools that keep us safer. When we order take-out, let us pray for the safety of restaurant workers as things open up again. If we get frustrated when our technology fails us, let us remember that God never does and never will.

And, as we journey together toward Easter, may we also focus on the glimmers of hope all around us. Vaccinations and more awareness of how to prevent spread are bringing the infection rates down in Kalamazoo County and in many places. With each vaccination, and each week of declining numbers, we grow closer to the day when we can reclaim much of what we have given up during this season. Easter is coming, friends. Easter always comes. Death and destruction will never have the last word, because Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia and, yay, God!

Grounded in living faith, receiving diversity as a gift, we seek to reflect Christ's light in God's world.

Continually discerning God's vision of grace and peace, we share inspirational worship, spiritual nurture, compassionate service to others, and the pursuit of justice—all to the glory of God.

At all services, masks will be required, and specific places in the sanctuary will be identified to sit with social distancing. We will also try to see that entries and exits respect the comfort and security levels of everyone.

It is hard to be more specific about worship options at this time. All of these plans are subject to review by Session, who will continue to consider possibilities and guide decisions about our options. Please watch for more information to come through email announcements.

Lent Faith Formation Opportunities:

For all ages - Adults, Youth, Children, Families

We're all experiencing Zoom fatigue and 'way too much time on electronics, so for the season of Lent, we are encouraging families to step away from the electronics and engage with one another in Lenten prayer and discipleship.

Lent in a Bag equips you with symbols of the season of Lent to help you to have prayer and/or conversation at home. A devotion is assigned for each week, focusing on one of the symbols in the bag. Use these props and devotions during your weekly Lenten meditation as you journey together with Jesus to the cross. These meditations are designed to be used as individuals or as a household. We encourage you to find ways to weave these daily devotions into the rhythms of your life.



Your bag contains a small canvas. As an individual or as a household, using paint or markers, or gluing items to the canvas, create your canvas however you wish – one color or multiple colors, symbols, images, or totally abstract designs. When your canvas feels complete, drop it by the church, or contact Pastor Chrissy about finding another way to get it back to the church. (Chrissy.westbury@kalamazoofirstpres.org). Be sure to include your name on the back of the canvas. Return the canvas by Palm Sunday, March 28, and watch for a church-wide art project to emerge on Easter Sunday!



Attention FPC Members: Hope Garden Work Starts in Spring!

Hope Garden, one of our Outreach activities, will open soon for initial planting of early veggies that can withstand some cooler weather. We invite any volunteers who would like to join us for fresh air, some moderate physical activity, and good company. The garden is located at 8882 "Q" Avenue (north side of the road), about 3/4 mile west of Zeb's Restaurant in Texas Corners. All of our outdoor Worship services last fall were at the garden property and it is a pleasant place to enjoy the outdoors while providing fresh food for our under-served neighbors.

We current have work sessions on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from about 9:30 to 12:30 p.m. but other hours can be arranged if there is enough interest. No experience is necessary, just a positive attitude, and willingness to grow veggies for the Ministry with Community and Loaves & Fishes. High School-age folks are also welcome, especially if you would like to learn more about growing plants, the source of our food, and how to help plants grow. We can use all ages of volunteers as there are many different tasks to perform and many are not too physically demanding. Appropriate clothing, especially shoes, are helpful since we do dig in the dirt. Additional benefits include good company and conversation, knowing you're doing your part to make Kalamazoo a better place, and opportunities to learn about gardening.

Hope Garden is located about 3/4 of a mile west of Texas Corners on "Q" Avenue and the shopping area located there. Center Street in Portage becomes "Q" Avenue once you pass US-131 (going west), If you pass Pretty Lake Camp you have gone too far. Turn around and join us for a rewarding time of helping others. 
