UPDATE FROM SESSION ON CHURCH OPERATION

At our meeting on Wednesday, May 26, Session discussed at length current realities and future possibilities for phasing into resumed activities for our church. We listened to varying perspectives and experiences representing as widely as possible individuals in our congregation and our community. We considered scientific guidelines from the CDC and other sources, including consultation at our meeting with the leading public health official for Kalamazoo and Calhoun counties. We have tried to be informed, sensitive, wise, and responsible, respecting the broad diversity of freedoms and limitations, comforts and passions that persist among us. We discerned the following way forward, appealing for Grace to reign among and through us all, as we sought to guide our decision.

As we move into the next phase of reopening in Worship on Sunday, June 13, we urge everyone to recognize and respect differing comfort levels, and to be sensitive to needs of others. June 13 was chosen as the date to change, given the perceived insufficient time to communicate and coordinate by Sunday, May 30; and because worship on Sunday, June 6, will include and center on many children and youth, not all of whom have had the opportunity to be vaccinated. As we strive as much as possible to be inclusive of all, we are grateful for your understanding and cooperation. Until June 13, we will continue to operate as we have, with masks and distancing protocols.

As of Sunday, June 13, in worship:

- 1. If you feel at all ill or compromised, please stay at home and avail yourself of our livestream.
- 2. If you are not fully vaccinated, masks remain mandated at all times when in our church.
- 3. If you are fully vaccinated, you are not required to wear a mask.
- 4. Cushions (and thus, seating) will remain on every other pew through the month of June.
- 5. When choosing a pew and relating at other times, please respect personal space. Remember that not everyone is at the same level of comfort in group settings.
- 6. We will resume congregational singing and collecting the offering.
- 7. We will continue to refrain from serving coffee and refreshments.
- 8. Prior registration for worship will no longer be necessary.

Respecting individual choice, please honor others' decision to continue wearing masks while singing, entering, and leaving, or at all times, as comfort dictates.

As of Monday, June 7, general church operation will be as follows:

- 1. If you feel at all ill or compromised, please stay at home and arrange business by phone, email, or other virtual communication.
- 2. Please, particularly, respect the comfort level of church staff. If they ask you to keep distance and/or wear masks, honor that request.
- 3. If you are not fully vaccinated, masks remain mandated at all times when in our church.
- 4. If you are fully vaccinated, you are not required to wear a mask.
- 5. The church building will be open for general business 9 a.m. 1 p.m. Monday through Friday, and for other meetings and appointments as coordinated. Operational hours may expand as resumed staffing makes it possible. As usual, if you want to be sure to connect, you may want to call ahead.
- 6. If you are planning a meeting at church, please contact Ann Johnson to coordinate the calendar.
- 7. Presence of the Custodial staff in the building for evening meetings will be discretionary, as long as another staff person present assumes responsibility for opening and closing.
