We move through heights of autumn glory to Thanksgiving and then winter soon to come. And in church we move through celebrating Reign of Christ Sunday—God's grace filling all creation, into Advent. Then we start again at the beginning, telling the story of God in Christ, longing for him to come among us. It's a season to anticipate gatherings we cherish with family and friends. It's our sacred season to watch, wait, then celebrate Holy Love manifest in an infant born to a young mother—vulnerable, in questionable condition, under Herod's shadow of threat. You see, beyond good ideas about morality or community, our central claim of faith is that relationship with the Divine became real, tangible, experiential in human life. Incarnation.

Of course, it's a story about Jesus. And as we tell it, sing it, gift it, it's really about us—a promise we live to fulfill. Holy Love made real, tangible, experiential in our human relationships. Maybe this season will seem even more poignant as we gather after all the ways we've been vulnerable, in questionable conditions, under the shadowy threat of COVID. At least, I hope we are grateful, giving thanks for whatever simple goodness and real human connection we can share.

Truth is, the pandemic isn't quite behind us yet. We search the stats. We hear the stories. Consistent scientific forecasts project a positive trend through months to come ... assuming we continue wise decisions. It's been uplifting to witness the slow, steady return of many to in-person worship and other activities, including a good number of visitors. Still, there remain people among us who feel particularly vulnerable, anxious about infectious possibilities. That's real and to be respected. It's important to be cautious.

I remain grateful for adaptations we made through this COVID time, and the investment of human effort and technology that enable virtual connections for worship, meetings, classes, personal conversations. We will gladly continue to stream live on Sunday mornings. Some committees may meet by Zoom. People in whose hearts First Pres holds a place of fondness will be able to relate and receive nourishment in some way, however near or far away. Hallelujah!

And in this season especially, let's continue to respect the fact that it's simply not the same as tangible, visceral human relations. As we celebrate the incarnation of Jesus, may we all find ways to express Holy Love through our real presence, as we are able. Maybe it's a return to sharing worship in our sanctuary. Maybe it's a careful visit or offering a ride to someone who can't get out on their own. Maybe it's connecting again with some person or way of service that has lapsed in the past eighteen months. Amid and far beyond whatever we may purchase, as a special gift this Christmas, let's find ways to forge human relations in Holy Love. That's God's promise we receive and celebrate in Jesus Christ. From the beginning, and in the end, that's what our living faith is really all about.




NEW 4-WEEK WOMEN'S BIBLE STUDY FOR ADVENT






MUSICAL ACTIVITIES AND EVENTS


CHRISTMAS CHOCOLATE 2021

PINE ISLAND BUILDING UPDATE

We are getting VERY close to having the funds needed to start discussing the final plan for the building project located at the Pine Island campus. Our target goal in fundraising is \$300,000 and we currently celebrate receiving contributions in excess of \$240,000. Many of you have viewed the renderings of the building and property that are located at both entries. This space can be utilized in unlimited ways, such as weddings, family gatherings, youth gatherings, optional worship experiences, etc. Creativity has no limits!

We continue to need additional contributions for both the building and, after that amount is obtained, for interior finishing. Our hope is that by early 2022, construction details can be finalized and ground-breaking can occur by spring/summer of 2022. Thanks to all who have contributed and will contribute, and to all who have kept in prayer this vision to expand our ministry.

MESSAGE FROM GHANA

Below is an excerpt from a letter from Josh Heikkila, our Mission co-worker in West Africa.

"In today's world, we often talk of the need to listen to diverse voices—'the danger of a single story,' as Nigerian author Chimamanda Ngozi Adichie has phrased it. This is without a doubt true, because listening to diverse voices greatly enriches us, not only on the level of faith, but also simply as human beings. But diverse voices can have different perspectives from our own, which can even be in profound disagreement with our own deeply held beliefs. Whether we like it or not, we still have to listen to these voices and respect them. Being dismissive of them only repeats the mistakes of the past."
