A MINUTE IN MINISTRY

As you probably know, we've had a number of staff transitions in the past couple of months: Pat Stromsta, Michael Montgomery, Cindy Hunter, Ann Johnson, Nik DeHaan, and Ann Ross. Each of these individuals has served our congregation's ministry well in many ways. Through them, members of our congregation and surrounding community have been touched deeply by Holy Love as a comfort, practical help, and beautiful inspiration. We have cherished their gifts. And I am grateful that in each case, service has been motivated by a desire to care for others and invest heartfelt devotion to the mission in Christ we share.

It is undoubtedly a loss for us. And for many among us, it comes with some shock or surprise. As you've expressed to me, we want life in our congregation to be a stable source of goodness, something we can depend on, especially in this particular period of so much uncertainty in society. In and through everything we say and do, we want people to be treated well, and we all want to grow in peace and loving service. Some have wondered, is something going on?

Well, friends, the answer is "Yes!" Absolutely, something is going on. In our COVID-altered society, many of us have asked what's really important, and decided to make life changes. We've seen the Great Resignation (as it's being called) in teachers, nurses, many professions, and a large social service agency whose leader I spoke with recently has experienced 50% change in their staff in the past year. And yes, there are always matters to work on in our relationships. No one is perfect. And even more minor matters we've been handling together get exacerbated greatly, of course, by all the stresses and complications of the pandemic. It hasn't been easy.

Still, it's important to know that these transitions have been motivated in large part by positive personal moves — career promotions and opportunities that fit better with life desired. In some ways, these transitions have been "in the works" for months, or worked on for years. Others are more unexpected recent developments. In all cases, I am grateful that each person is moving into a next step that engenders hope, possibility, and expected goodness. And I'm grateful for whatever experiences in our congregation have empowered that direction.

No, the coinciding of these changes is not ideal. And though we've tried to plan diligently for both smooth transitions and respectful honoring of each individual's service, of course, it isn't ideally gradual and steady. Clearly, we are in the midst of challenges. And clearly, as we try to meet them there will be more complications, frustrations, and imperfections. We are humans, trying to be open to movement of the Holy Spirit, as we stumble forward together. Please, know that the Personnel Committee—and in the case of music positions, Worship and Music Committee members—have been working expeditiously, proactively, and diligently toward discerning details of staff positions and persons to fill them.

As we move forward, I offer a few points of encouragement (at least). I'm happy to listen to anyone with questions and concerns, offering what perspective I can and receiving what ideas arise. Please, contact me. Good communication is always challenging work. It will be even more critically so in the weeks ahead. If you're making or changing plans or trying to coordinate any church business, please persist patiently. And this experience is all a reminder that our work in the church is ever the collective effort of the people (that's you), among whom staff serves to empower. If you're willing to volunteer some help with particular tasks as they arise, please let Chrissy or me know!!

Amid challenges, there ever remain opportunities. We can be sure that particular staffing patterns and functions are sure to evolve through this process. Most importantly, I trust deeply and sincerely that God is with us in this moment. And the Holy


Spirit will move through us, bringing new possibilities and vitality, while strengthening even further our loving relationships pulsing at the heart of our life together. As we keep working on it all with humility and grace, loving patience and faithful perseverance, I'm confident that our congregational life will remain a dependable source of goodness and faithful witness to God's Love in Jesus Christ for the fullness of peace in our world.

Kathleen Robertson King will lead staff resourcing of the Health Ministry Committee, dovetailing with her work with Deacons. Amber Nettleton will lead staff resourcing of the Congregational Life Committee, including the process of new member connections. Seth Weeldreyer will continue to lead staff resourcing of Worship and Music, Personnel, Finance, and Endowment Committees, with some support of Property Committee efforts, particularly around development of our Pine Island Campus.

Other staff will also continue to faithfully resource committees, as follows: Louise Taylor—Endowment and Finance Committees, Shawn Smith—Property Committee, Meredith Alspach—Faith Formation, Hannah Foreman—Communications.

PINE ISLAND BUILDING PROGRESS

We are excited to report that fundraising for a chapel on our Pine Island campus has achieved extraordinary success. As of publication of this *Presbyter*, final numbers are not yet in, but we have far exceeded our goal! This generous resource is largely driven by contributions of a small number of individuals formerly associated with Pine Island Presbyterian Church, along with many contributions of other members in our congregation. It is inspiring to witness this collaborative collective effort to provide a space for our ministry and witness in that beautiful place. As we have previously publicized, all funds we have received are above and beyond pledging to the general fund. And no other capital resources of our congregation will be used to complete construction of this project.

Resources also include other leading gifts. In line with our consideration of environmental responsibility and sustainability, as this *Presbyter* goes to press, we are also finalizing a significant contribution from the J.A. Woollam Foundation, connected with Session's approval of a conservation easement on the property. And we have received a pledge from a congregation member for further funds to support in full solar energy for the chapel. We have also created the Laurie Tupper / Pine Island Endowment Fund to provide for future maintenance and improvement. And a grant from the Myrtle Collaborative will be used in part for furnishings and finishing touches to make the space usable.

With these funds in hand, we will proceed to finalize the plan with the builders Session previously approved. Those plans will go to Session for final authorization / approval before any work begins. We hope to break ground by some time in the spring / summer, dependent on fluidity in the construction market. We want everyone who may be interested to be a part of this exciting project! As we work to clarify more details to guide the construction process, please watch for information and opportunities to discuss plans and possibilities. We will try to offer a variety of times for people to learn more, ask questions, offer ideas, and generally help to make this vision become a reality.

We are grateful to the following people who have invested many hours and much effort as part of the team leading this Pine Island building project: Ellen Dykhuis (Property Committee moderator), Jeff Barnum, Bob Cowell, Kathy Jennings, Bob Poel, Susanne Rose, Marlene Stoops, Laurie Tupper, and Deb Weurding, all supported by Seth Weeldreyer.



January 18 Chapters 4-5


January 25 Chapters 6 - 8

UPCOMING CHURCH ACTIVITIES


W.O.W. (WISDOM IN ONE WORD)




