# A MINUTE IN MINISTRY

Tell Me a Story

Recently, Pastor Seth and I sat down with Session for a little while after church. This is an annual Rehearsal, in which we bring together the newly ordained and installed elders, along with the folks continuing in this role, for two purposes. There is always some training to be done – nuts and bolts information about how we do the work of the church – how to fill out a voucher, whom to talk to when you need to get something on the calendar, where to send monthly committee minutes – things of that nature.

But the real purpose of this gathering is to begin laying a foundation of relationship upon which we can build the work in the months ahead. Decision making is difficult work. Discerning God's voice amid the clamor of the world is difficult work. Collaboration can be difficult work. And the beauty and particular challenge of our Presbyterian way of doing things is that we can do nothing on our own. All of our work is collaborative. All of our decisions are made together – and whenever possible, by consensus. In order for that to be successful, relationships must be formed. We must learn to see one another as friends, siblings, teammates with a common goal. We may not agree on how to get to that goal, but we must recognize, in one another, the desire to get there together.

So, on this particular Sunday, we began with a question. What is something about you that most of the people in this group do not know? It doesn't have to be your deepest, darkest secret. It can even be something a little silly. What is something we simply don't know about you? The stories that arose – some silly, some serious, some fairly vulnerable – all revealed a little bit about each of us in the room. Something human, something relational, something that is a part of who we are and how we approach life.

Stories have a way of doing that. Of revealing pieces of who we are and what kinds of experiences, piled upon one another, formed us. Each of us comes to the table with stories, with experiences, with particular ways of understanding the world based on things that have happened to us in the past.

Our church, our congregation, has been formed by stories – individual stories and communal stories – shared and built upon since 1834. We have discerned God's call as a community through those stories, and we have come together to strive for common goals out of those stories. Just over three years ago, the Pine Island congregation made the choice to join their story with ours, and now we have more stories to build upon and to learn from. What are our stories? What are the stories we tell ourselves and what are the stories our community tells about us? And how do those stories reveal something about who we have been, who we are, and who God is calling us to be? In a time of great division, personal stories are a way to enter into challenging conversations from a place of grace. "Here's a little bit about what formed me that speaks to why I feel this way."

Stories take time to tell. Relationships, and foundations, take time to build. In a turbo-charged, fast-moving world of information and opinion, it can be a challenge to slow ourselves down and take time to share stories. That's what I would like to invite us to do, in this time. Let's slow down. Let's take the time to learn a little about one another, and about the stories of our church and our community. Look around. Find someone you don't know as well as you'd like, and say:

"Tell me a story."

Grounded in living faith, receiving diversity as a gift, we seek to reflect Christ's light in God's world.

Continually discerning God's vision of grace and peace, we share inspirational worship, spiritual nurture, compassionate service to others, and the pursuit



# CELEBRATE THE VISION (CTV) UPDATE

Celebrate the Vision has been going through some exciting changes in recent weeks. Our Wednesday evening meal, which we have provided for many years, continues to be strong as our community grows and strengthens. Pat Stromsta, Chrissy Westbury, and Meredith Alspach are working together, along with a powerhouse group of dedicated volunteers, to be sure we continue to develop ways to be in relationship with our neighbors. Every Wednesday, from 5-5:30 or so, we serve soup, sandwiches, fruit, and dessert (as well as the favorite hot chocolate and coffee!) to 20-30 folks from our neighborhood. If it is above freezing, we pull out tables and chairs and heat lamps for a comfortable place to enjoy the meal and visit with one another. If it's colder, we serve a take-out meal.

In January, we added a collaboration with the Peer Navigator program at the Recovery Institute. Every Wednesday, a peer navigator is present at CTV to talk with folks about what they are needing and to help point them toward community resources. The library has been working with Peer Navigators for several years, and this seemed like a good way to broaden that reach, and help our CTV friends, as well.

We are so grateful to all those who have stepped up to help make soup, serve meals, purchase fruit, water, paper products, and really lend a hand with whatever is needed. We've even been able to reach out in a collaborative spirit to First Presbyterian Church in Richland to invite them to be a part of our ministry with our neighbors. Members of FPC Richland have been providing soups and desserts once a month!

Many of us who work with CTV say that our Wednesday evenings are the highlight of our week. The relationships formed, the joy felt, the fun each Wednesday is energizing and exciting. It's good to see Christ's light in the world! If you want to be a part of the fun, come join us on a Wednesday, or let Meredith know if you would like to provide soup or dessert!

## WELCOME RESETTLEMENT FAMILY!

At midnight on December 22, the family arrived in Kalamazoo from their former home, to re-settle in the Kalamazoo area.

The family is temporarily living in a home in Portage. Upon arriving, a team from our church, supported by Bethany Christian Services, began assisting the resettlement of this family to the United States.

The Refugee Resettlement Team at FPC is divided into six subcommittees: Education, Medical, Transportation, Grocery, Hospitality and Finances.

Speaking only Pashto, the family is very welcoming in spite of communication difficulties. They have begun ESL training in January, two to three times per week with Carol Parfit, JoAnn Yochim and Jan Carpenter. Additional classes will be provided through Kalamazoo Literacy Council. The children hope to begin school in the next few weeks.

Health visits at the Family Health Center are currently being scheduled for each family member. Transportation is being organized by Bev Murray and Odile Ndayishimiye. They are in the process of organizing volunteer drivers from our church and the wider community. Dana Underwood and her team are coordinating grocery shopping twice a month, and deliveries from Loaves and Fishes on alternating weeks.

The family is also learning about Kalamazoo and living in the US through cultural orientation classes provided by Bethany. Donna and Paul have taken the family sledding. Everyone seemed to enjoy the outing. The mother laughed and talked at the top of the hill and seemed to enjoy it very much. Dad and the kids had so much fun going up and down the hill. The youngest child has a lot of energy and the parents and the two oldest children seem to want to engage the most at this time. They are very appreciative and attentive. Future outings are being planned.

We hope to be able to introduce you to this delightful family in the coming months. Until then, please keep the family in your prayers as they make this big transition!






February 1 Chapter 3: Practicing Piety
